WHO WE ARE

The Battle Creek Clean Water Partnership is the City of Battle Creek; the City of Springfield; the Calhoun County Water Resources Commissioner; the Calhoun County Road Department; the Calhoun County Community Development; the townships of Bedford, Emmett, Leroy, Newton, and Pennfield; the Hart-Dole-Inouye Federal Center; Kellogg Community College; and Battle Creek Area Schools joining together with the common goal of protecting the waterways in our area.

PROTECTION POLICIES THE WELLHEAD PROTECTION PLAN

To protect drinking water in our county, Wellhead Protection Plans have been developed for six communities: the City of Battle Creek, the City of Albion, the City of Marshall, Pennfield Township, and the Village of Athens.

Elements include:

- A pro-active initiative to prevent contamination
- A designated wellhead protection area around each well field
- Land use and zoning ordinances when new construction occurs within the area to prevent potential contamination
- A contingency plan in case a contamination incident occurs

WATERSHED PROTECTION

The problem of Nonpoint Source pollution (NPS) is not a small one. The United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) reports it as the leading remaining cause of water quality problems. We all play a part and may not realize it. Each and every one of us contributes to the problem because it results from human activity on the land. It is our responsibility to do all we can to protect our surface water as individuals, and as a community.


HOW TO DO YOUR PART

You can follow the simple steps outlined in the calendar to help protect our water from sources of pollution. The steps we take now will help protect our water for future generations.

UNDERSTANDING THE WATER CYCLE

Water is something we often take for granted. From the lakes and streams we play and fish in, to the water we use everyday to clean and nourish our bodies, water plays an important part in our lives. It's a natural resource that we simply can't live without. That's why it's our responsibility to protect our water resources for the next generation. In order to do that, we need to better understand the water cycle and how it works.

WHAT IS GROUNDWATER?



- Water that collects underground, filling cracks and spaces in layers of sand, gravel and rock
- Layers of earth that hold enough groundwater to supply a well are referred to as aquifers
- Rain and snow runoff recharge the groundwater supply
- Pollutants can seep into the groundwater making it unsafe to use

HOW IS GROUNDWATER USED?

- Groundwater makes up nearly 50% of the drinking water in the State of Michigan
- Groundwater is used for agricultural irrigation and a variety of industrial and business purposes
- Groundwater can also be used for geothermal heating

WHAT IS SURFACE WATER?

- Rain water and runoff that collects in lakes, rivers, streams, and wetlands on the earth's surface
- Surface water also comes from groundwater

HOW IS SURFACE WATER USED?


- Surface waters provide a natural habitat for wildlife
- As a recreational area for the people of our community
- Interconnected with groundwater—our source of drinking water

HOW DO POLLUTANTS ENTER SURFACE WATERS?

- From Point Sources, such as direct discharge through ditches or pipes from factories and wastewater treatment plants
- From Nonpoint Sources over large areas that include agriculture, urban, forested and rural areas that enter waterways through surface runoff or groundwater
- Storm water is known as Nonpoint Source pollution. Common contaminants include: fertilizers, pesticides, grass clippings, leaves, oil, grease, toxic chemicals, sediment, and livestock and pet waste
- Too much phosphorus has made its way into both the Kalamazoo River Watershed and the St. Joseph River Watershed causing increased algae blooms and lower oxygen levels affecting aquatic life

OUR WATERSHED

What is a watershed? It is an area where all water drains into the same body of water, such as a river or lake, based on topography and elevation. Two major watersheds are in our county, the Kalamazoo River Watershed and the St. Joseph River Watershed. The rivers and their tributaries flow until they reach Lake Michigan.

CLEAN WATER TIP:

KEEP ROAD SALT AND DE-ICING CHEMICALS OUT OF OUR WATER
Shovel snow and ice early and often to limit your use of sand, salt, and de-icing chemicals.

ACT:

When safety requires it, try an alternative to salt. Look at the USEPA's Design for the Environment webpage at: www.epa.gov/saferchoice

PHARMACEUTICALS

Never flush unused medications down the drain or toilet. They can end up in the ground, and eventually in the water we share.

CLEAN WATER TIP:

FERTILIZER

The State of Michigan has passed a law banning the use of harmful phosphorus lawn fertilizers in order to protect our water resources. Check the label before buying fertilizer. The bag will show a series of three numbers. Look for the ZERO in the middle to find a phosphorus-free fertilizer that won't pollute our water.

ACT:

Adopt a storm drain on your street and please keep it clean of leaves, dirt, grass clippings, and other debris.

CLEAN WATER TIP:

RAIN WATER

Runoff from rain water is the only thing that should wash down our storm drains. Anything else — grass clippings, leaves, motor oil, even fertilizer — is considered an illicit discharge. If you witness suspicious dumping into storm drains, visit www.bcwater.org

Rain barrels are an excellent resource to help reduce storm runoff and lower water bills. Purchase a rain barrel at www.upcycle-products.com

CLEAN WATER TIP:
IRRIGATION

Watering plants too much and too frequently results in shallow roots, weed growth, diseases, fungus, and stormwater runoff. Don't over water. Learn plants' water needs and water appropriately.

ACT:

Properly close abandoned wells on your property. They can act as conduits for contamination of groundwater. Call the Calhoun County Health Department for information at 269-969-6341.

CLEAN WATER TIP:

TRAVEL TRAILER WASTE DISPOSAL
 Now that camping season is nearly over, remember to properly dispose of your black water tank waste at a designated RV sanitary dump station. Improper disposal of waste contaminates the ground and water and leaves the “great outdoors”— not-so-great!

ACT:

Maintain septic systems as improperly working septic systems can pollute both surface water and groundwater. If you have a septic system, have it checked and pumped every few years to ensure it is working properly.

CLEAN WATER TIP:

CAR WASHING

Wash your car at a commercial car wash or on the lawn so that wash water can be absorbed and naturally filtered, avoiding streets and storm drains.

ACT:

Maintain oil tanks both above and underground, as leaking underground storage tanks are a major source of contamination to both surface water and groundwater. Check tanks regularly for leaks.

CLEAN WATER TIP:

FALL LEAVES

The next time you rake your leaves, mulch, bag, or compost them, but don't let them run into the storm drains. Adopt a storm drain on your street and please keep it clean of leaves, dirt, grass clippings, and other debris.

ACT:

Drink tap water instead of bottle water. Gallon after gallon of purified tap water from area water treatment plants is pumped directly to our homes and businesses everyday for less than a penny a gallon. Low cost. No bottles. No waste.

CLEAN WATER TIP:

WASTE WATER

Toilets are only meant for one activity, and you know what we're talking about! When the wrong thing is flushed, results can include costly backups on your own property or problems at our wastewater treatment plant.

ACT:

All of those bathroom wipes that are advertised as "flushable" aren't so flushable after all! When these wipes are flushed, clogs and backups can occur in the sanitary sewer system. This leads to costly repairs! Remember — No Wipes in the Pipes!

CLEAN WATER TIP:

De-icers such as magnesium chloride have fewer adverse environmental impacts to our water and are not as corrosive as sodium chloride. Check labels to choose a deicer that fits your conditions and apply it early and sparingly.

Try using all natural /non-toxic household cleaners! Materials like lemon juice, baking soda, and vinegar make awesome cleaning products, are inexpensive, and environmentally-friendly.


