

City of Battle Creek – Fireworks – Law and Guidance

There are four holidays when you can use fireworks at your home:

-New Year's Eve – Dec. 31

11 a.m. New Year's Eve until 1 a.m. New Year's Day

-Memorial Day – Saturday/Sunday before the last Monday in May

11 a.m.-11:45 p.m.

-Independence Day – June 29-July 4 (+ July 5 ONLY if a Friday or Saturday)

11 a.m.-11:45 p.m.

-Labor Day – Saturday/Sunday before the first Monday in September

11 a.m.-11:45 p.m.

Fireworks violations can cost you \$1,000.

City Police and Fire enforce the law, but have to take higher-priority calls first.

Call the non-emergency police number to make a fireworks complaint in Battle Creek: 269-781-0911

Fireworks can be difficult for veterans, pets, and others. Please respect your neighbors and only use fireworks at home when they're allowed.

Remember: No fireworks allowed on public property; consider concrete surfaces for lighting fireworks; do not use fireworks under the influence of drugs or alcohol

Remember: Small kids should not handle fireworks; supervise older kids; do not hold onto lit fireworks; do not try to re-light or handle fireworks that did not work; keep a water source close by

Consider attending public fireworks displays instead. The Battle Creek Field of Flight Air Show and Balloon Festival offers two shows at the airport. See fieldofflight.com for the schedule.
